

SECOND HALF-TERM

1) First homework task (Logo pages 110 - 113)

Lesson Objectives:

- i) To be order a meal in a restaurant
- ii) To be able to use the formal form of “you = Sie”

Using the new food vocabulary pupils have learnt from pages 110-113 of their Logo textbooks plus any extra food vocabulary they know, pupils are to design for display their own restaurant menus. They should include at least 4 starters (die Vorspeisen), 4 main courses (die Hauptspeisen), 4 deserts (die Nachtische) and hot and cold drinks (Getränke). Pupils should then write four food orders to describe what themselves and members of their family might like to eat and drink at the restaurant. For example, “Als Vorspeise nehme ich Suppe, meine Mutter möchte Salat und mein Vater nimmt Fisch.”

Rather than write 4 food orders, some pupils may wish to write 4 sentences in the past to describe what themselves and members of their family ate in the restaurant. For example, “Als Vorspeise habe ich Suppe gegessen, meine Mutter hat Salat gegessen und mein Vater hat Fisch bestellt.” They might also choose to include sentences to describe what they will eat in the restaurant next time, using the future tense. “Nachste Woche werde ich Suppe essen, meine Mutter wird Salat essen und mein Vater wird Fisch bestellen.”

This piece of work will be teacher - assessed and will be used for display. It is also be useful in terms of revision for the module 2 exam in May.

2) Second homework task (Logo pages 100 and 101)

Lesson Objectives:

- i) To be able to send a letter/ a parcel at the post office
- ii) To be able to ask formal questions
“Haben Sie ...? Darf ich ...? Was kostet ...?”

Pupils are to access the “Linguascope” website and go onto “Linguastars.” They have the website address and the log – in details in their exercise books. Pupils are to work through some of the exercises already discussed in class on the post office topic on the website, as a way of revising some of the post office vocabulary. Pupils are then to go to the “resources to print out” which they have been shown in the lesson and are to complete the first worksheet from the resources. They have the option either of printing out the worksheet themselves and writing on the sheet or to copy out the sentences from the worksheet into their books and to complete the exercises in their books. We will then go over these exercises in the following lesson.

The homework can then be used as useful revision for the module 2 exam which pupils will take in May.
